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

Editorial

You can sense it in the air, and you can smell it in the pits. Or is it the other way round? There's no doubting the speedway summer of 2008/09 is about to step up a notch. How can you tell? Two night meetings begin to appear on the calendar, cars, drivers and teams start to travel more, followed closely by the keener spectators amongst us.

In both Islands over the next couple of weekends, a variety of classes start to get into the serious stuff. Leading the way is MORE FM Woodford Glen, first out of the blocks with the annual and extremely keenly contested Super Saloon Champion of Champions. The North Island invasion is down a little on numbers this year, but certainly not on quality.

A quick glance at the last seven running's of the New Zealand Super Saloon Championship reveals that four of the winners have recently retired from active competition, the other three are entered here this weekend. But they're certainly not going to get it all their own way, several South Islanders having already shown good form around the Glen this season. More on this meeting is covered within the pages of this issue of Triple Go!!!!

All eyes are still on the biggie of the season anywhere in the country, and this year that event just happens to be right here at your local. The Ampro Tools New Zealand Super Stock title is little more than six weeks away, and the second regional title of the season was held at Stratford last weekend. The first three home were #94P Roydon Collingwood, #66R Steve Hampton and Christchurch's own (and 2008/09 Canterbury Champion) Malcolm Ngatai driving the now familiar silver #19C. All three are obviously in form, and all three will be contenders come January.

Much bigger news for many however, is the announcement that Nelson's Craig Boote, winner last time the event was staged at Woodford Glen in 1997 and long rumoured to be emerging from retirement for this event, has now decided not to compete. The car is still expected however, and we should now be seeing "Quick" Nick Fowler behind the wheel for a lot more meetings than originally planned. Don't be surprised if the combination fronts here on a couple of occasions before Christmas.

Whilst Fowler will be very competitive, the chance to see Boote race again at this level appears to be lost forever. One of only two drivers ever to win three titles (Kevin Free 1970, 1976 & 1993, Boote three times in four years, 1997, 1999 & 2000), one of only two drivers to win New Zealand titles back to back (along with Dave Evans in 1984 & 1985), Boote was and still is a modern day legend. Both Boote's and Evans' first victories were here at Woodford Glen. What history will be created here come January 4th. Make sure you're here to witness it in person. Meantime it's the first of several big Super Saloon shows of the summer.

This is the season of 2008/2009. Welcome, and enjoy.



The Summer Hots Up

As mentioned in the Editorial, the first of several North Island invasions hits the MORE FM Woodford Glen Speedway this weekend. At the time of writing the North Island contingent consisted of 2007 New Zealand Super Saloon champion Brent Emerson (now racing as #7M following his relocation to Tauranga), 2006 NZ champion Steve Williams (#21H), 2002 NZ champion Dean Waddell (#81M) and the revelation of last summer, Shane McIntyre in the #26M car. Emerson introduced his brand new Lovelady built car to the Baypark concrete work last Saturday night however, and the odd rumour has circulated that Russell Donovan (#71M) was intending to travel down late in the week, maybe either replacing him or adding himself to the list?

Emerson would certainly be hoping to make it here if at all possible, I'm sure, as he's appeared to struggle a little – by his impeccable standards anyway - in his opening meetings with the new car at both Huntly and Baypark. A weekend's racing under the watchful expert eye of John Lovelady would no doubt be of great assistance in dialling the new car in, Brent having other important South Island dates marked on his calendar come January. Whether the car will be able to be driven in the same style, thinking back to the difference between Emerson's tail-out style in his old Halcrow chassis when compared with, say, Greg Keegan around the Glen in his Lovelady, remains to be seen, but watch out over the following weeks.

Steve Williams has a new paint job on the familiar Harris-chassied Mustang, and if anything he's going even stronger. Whether it's by coincidence or not, the spectacular wheel-waving ways of the past seem to have gone, being replaced by even more forward motion than before. Woodford Glen has never been a happy hunting ground for Steve in the past, mostly due to mechanical gremlins creeping in and limiting performance, but he obviously loves the hospitality and I'm sure he'll keep coming back until the results change. Based on his early season form up north, that could very well be this weekend. Dean Waddell could be described as something of an enigma around the Glen. Then again, it could be argued he's easy to read. Based on a couple of visits last summer, he's virtually unbeatable during the shorter "sprint" heat races, but historically fades when the all important feature event comes around. He certainly proved himself to be one of the more brave with his ability to hold the outside line for lap after lap, and with what he learned here last summer, added to his early season stunning form around Baypark, Dean would be my pick to extremely close to emerging victorious by the end of the weekend.

Shane McIntyre surprised many with his performance in the Hoopla! here at the Glen last summer. Virtually unbeatable around the enormous expanses of Baypark, many felt he wouldn't be competitive anywhere else. Driving style and car size were both quoted as reasons why, and when things didn't go well at last season's New Zealand title down in Dunedin the knockers felt vindicated. They obviously don't know Shane too well, and the Hoopla! saw him slowly dial the car in over the weekend and deservedly finish on the podium despite late race problems. Like Waddell, the McIntyre car is dressed in black this year.

Still recovering from major surgery, my own speedway viewing this season has been limited to one visit to Western Springs speedway in Auckland. I may only be able to make one or two more nights between now and Christmas, so I'm certainly envious of those attending Woodford Glen this weekend as they're going to be treated to something special. There is nothing quite like witnessing inter-Island competition, and Woodford Glen plays host to many such nights over the next few weeks.

And I'm sure, despite the build up I've given the North Island contingent above, Richie Taylor – based on his scintillating early season form – and the rest of the South Island contingent will be doing their best to retain this title in the south.

This weekend sees the running of the AmPro Tools Super Saloon Champion of Champions, with four North Island drivers joining seven other south island visitors to compliment the ten local drivers who will be out to ensure that the Champion comes from Woodford Glen after Greg Keegan's fantastic drive to win it last season. The local drivers will be full of confidence after having racing the Super Saloon series two weeks ago, getting the opportunity to test set-ups and racing lines in preparation for this event.

2NZ Josh Boulton had his car absolutely flying in the final stages of the 25 lap final of the Super Saloon series two weeks ago with the set-up of his car perfect for the ever-changing track conditions. He will have taken plenty of knowledge away from this which he will no doubt use over the next two nights to his advantage.

We haven't seen much this season of current 3NZ Greg Keegan, this won't be a problem though as he has driven around Woodford Glen so many times. As I have mentioned above, Greg took out last seasons Champion of Champions where he started the final race on pole, before drifting back to third. He then passed 11N Ian Burson and 81M Dean Waddell mid-race before the perfect set-up of his car which was obviously set-up for him to finish the race faster as the track begins to slick off and the racing lines change, enabled him to pull away and leave the field in his wake. This was a typical drive from Keegan as he maintained his smooth, consistent style of driving to comfortably win.

This season, 16C Ben Apernethy has really begun to come of age and should relish the challenge from the North Island drivers ahead of the New Zealand Championships in Cromwell in January 2009. This will be a big test, but there will be no doubt that he will be more than up to it.

The ever-green 6C Dennis Bolt returns this weekend to improve on his 7th place in the final last season. Dennis has raced in this event many times and is one of the big threats to the North Island drivers with his racing guile and experience out on the track a real treat to watch from the terraces. Watch out for more classic Dennis Bolt driving this weekend, as he will use all of his knowledge of the track over many seasons racing here at Woodford Glen.

The other Boulton, Bruce in the immaculate 881C car has been getting quicker and quicker the more track time the car has had. He has been driving some great lines and perfecting the set-up of the car to get the best out it, especially in the closing laps of a race.

One of the big improvers this season, 27C Trevor Elliott will have plenty of confidence going in to this event after his fast finishing third place in the final of the Super Saloon series two weeks ago. He made two excellent passes to secure third placing and vital points in the series. He has the ex-1NZ Shane Maaka car ideally set-up to finish races fast and with this in mind he will pose a big threat to visiting drivers who might get caught out. 32C Martin Harcourt, 444C Kevin Huddlestone and 28C Steve Peterson have been flying under the radar, with consistency playing a major part in their final placings this season as they have been many battles with visiting drivers no doubt they will be determined to show what they are made of.

And then there is new Canterbury Champion 58C Richie Taylor, who has been in superb form so far this season and would be one of the early favourites for the event. The 25 year racing veteran warmed up for this weekends racing with a fantastic drive to win the first round of the Super Saloon series two weeks ago with a determined drive to hold out 2NZ Josh Boulton. He is not afraid to take the outside line and pass cars right out near the wall, making him one of the crowd favourites. There is no doubt that with the high quality of the drivers here this weekend, bold outside passing will be required as there are plenty of drivers out there who also aren't afraid to do the same thing.

So there you have it, the locals have a very strong chance to retain the AmPro Tools Super Saloon Champion of Champion title, but with a strong field assembled here this weekend, the racing will be hard, fast and action packed. Added to this the eleven visitors to compete and you have the recipe for a great two nights of Super Saloon racing.

t had been a long day. One of those days when the phone never stopped ringing, the emails never stopped arriving, and the coffee cup never got emptied. he stands on the roof of his car to wave the chequered flag."

Palmerston North Superstocks have been at the forefront of the New Zealand Superstock Championships since the first title was contested in 1965/66. This no doubt will not be any different come the 3rd and 4th of January when the Ampro Tools New Zealand Superstock Championships hits the More FM Woodford Glen Speedway.

The list of past champions shows that Palmerston North contracted drivers have won more New Zealand titles than any other track since it has been officially contested. There seems to have been a production line of great drivers come out of the mighty Manawatu track down the years, names such as Robertson, Evans and Parkes, who have competed on the biggest stages both as individuals and as a team, with now another group of drivers venturing south aiming to do the same with one thing on their minds come January – to take 1NZ back to Palmerston North.

It is anticipated that the number of Palmerston North cars descending on Woodford Glen will be in double figures reflecting the strength of the class in Palmerston North. With names like past winners Wayne Hemi and Simon Joblin, current World 240 Champion Peter Bengston, 2x 3NZ Shane Penn, former 2NZ Peter Rees, former 2 and 3NZ Roydon Collingwood and Andy McCabe all expected. They all have quick cars along with loads of experience racing in major titles with the added bonus of also having driven at Woodford Glen many times before.

There are also others such as 77p Wayne Norris who is driving the ex-Rodney Wood 51R car, 5P Bruce Ward, 57P Dave Tarrant and 98P Craig Humphries who are seasoned campaigners who are relative un-knowns in the South Island that have plenty of racing experience and have the possibility of sneaking into the final 26.

While most of the drivers named haven't had their cars out on the track yet for various reasons, those that have, have been getting plenty of laps in. Particularly new tank commander Brett Hyslop, who has purchased the former Scott Miers Tank from three seasons ago, and is one who could make a real impact if he attends especially if his recent form is anything to go by. He has been rolling cars and causing as much mayhem as possible in the limited racing opportunities he has had to race so far this season.

Others to be in great early season form have been 7P Shane Penn who has been winning almost every race he has entered in his ever-reliable silver bullet. While Peter Rees has been in menacing form in both his stockcar and Superstock, with plenty of hitting getting dealt out, this is good practice for him as he will no doubt be using his bumper a lot during the Championships which he won't hesitate to do especially if the finals continues to become a big teams race.






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Fireworks Review

Meanwhile, the wins were shared around and with plenty of action in each of the three races it was hard to concentrate on one particular driver, so credit must be given to the drivers for their excellent driving to put a show on for the big crowd in attendance.

The Ministocks were back for a final hit-out before their Canterbury Champs, with plenty of use of the bumper from everyone giving the crowd plenty of entertainment. This enabled the wins to be shared between 47c Chris Hall, 24c Darren Kerr and 33c Jono Garthley, with no-one being spared from a hit or two!

In the A Grade Saloons there was some very good close racing with the field staying bunched together all night.

71c William Woodhouse, 72c Peter Schouten and 73c Mark Growcott filled the podium places throughout the night, only 4c Bruce Scott spoiling the party in race 1 with an excellent win.

The Super Stocks managed to get some practice in before the Glen Eagles went away to Nelson to take on the Tigers, with 59c Brad Rosewarne in dynamic form taking 27c Peter Field out in Race 1, along with plenty of other hits being dished out to those who dared get into his way. For the second race Brad was able to get a drive in the 19c Malcolm Ngatai car, with Malcolm exchanging race duties for commentary duties. Brad was going well until what looked like mechanical issues struck and he pulled infield. The third race ended strangely when it appeared that Ngatai, back behind the wheel, was heading towards a comfortable victory when 12c Nick Selfe sped up and past a slowing 19c who must of thought that the race was in the bag. It was a classic case of racing to the flag, Selfe taking great satisfaction from an un-expected win.

In the Modifieds, 29e Glen Leech dominated with 2 wins from the rear of the field in races 2 and 3, added to a 2nd in race 1, but 46c Bradley Stack scored a much deserved win in the first to deny Glen Leech his hatrick. 84c Natasha Rodgers raced hard all night, but couldn't get past Leech who seemed to have his set-up perfect for the track throughout the evening, the "Queen of the Clay" trying everything to get past to no avail.

The opening round of the fantastic Super Saloon Series went the way of 58c Richie Taylor, who managed to hold off a very fast finishing 2NZ Josh Boulton to win. 27c Trevor Elliot put in a massive drive to finish third from mid-field in the third race, making many passes count, especially on 46e Paddy North and 881c Bruce Boulton, to seize and then maintain third place until the finish of the 25 lap final.
